


Silver Spring, MD, division Economic Summary


Unemployment rates for the Silver Spring division, selected area counties, and the nation


Average weekly wages for all industries by county

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector






Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide


